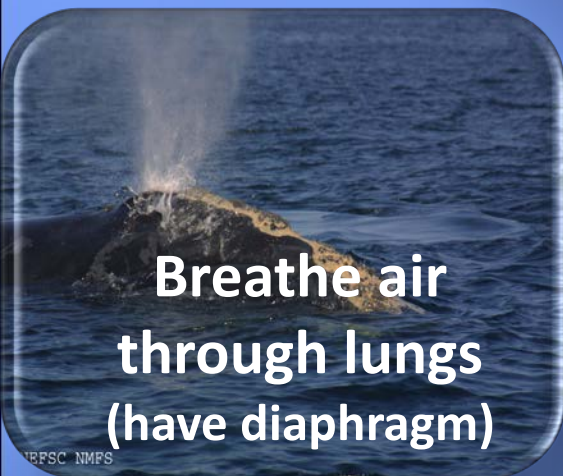
Live Birth

Mammals adapted for life in the marine environment



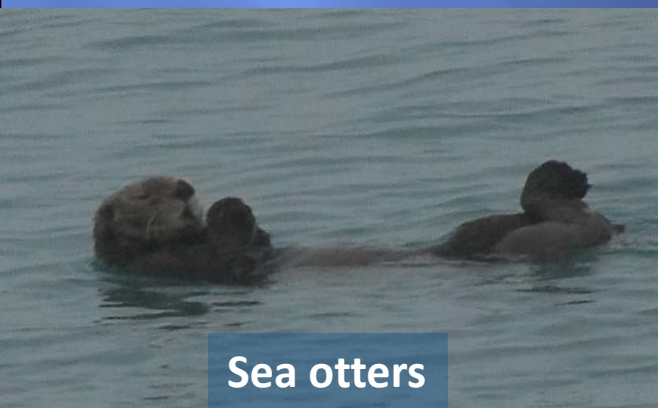
Cetaceans

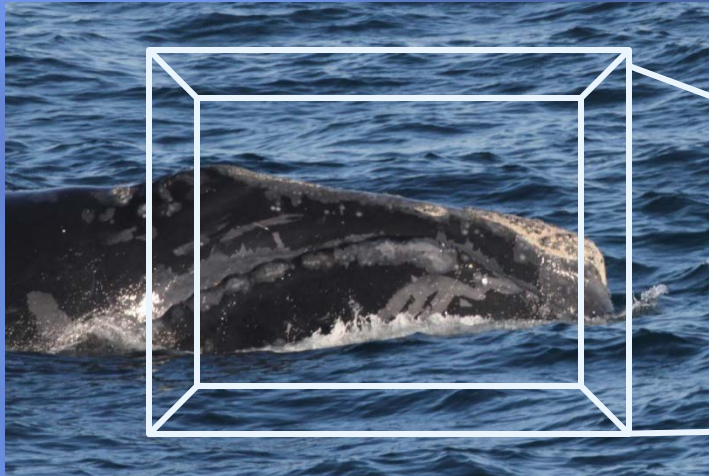

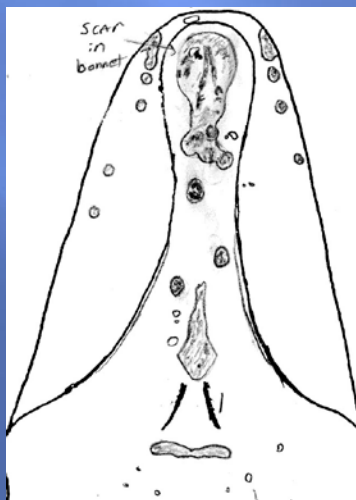

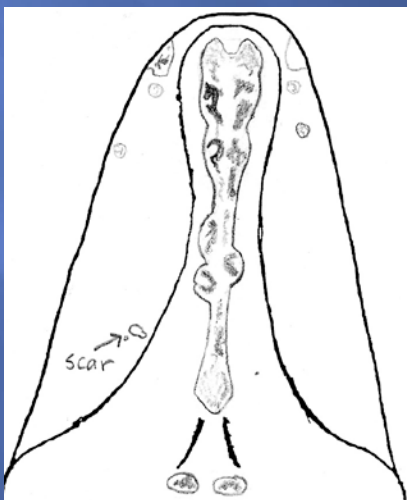
